SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH OBSERVED

Mental Health Association in Orange County, Inc.'s (MHA) Rape Crisis Services

Program is declaring April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month. During this month, this agency will be joining with people throughout the state and the nation to focus the public's attention on this important issue. The theme for 2014 is "Prevent Teen Dating Violence".

Sexual violence is a crime of epidemic proportions. It affects everyone. 1 in 5 girls and 1 in 6 boys are sexually abused before their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. At least 80% of sexual assault and rape are perpetrated by someone the victim knows.

The Orange County Rape Crisis Program is the only program of its kind in the area providing cutting edge, sensitive and specialized services to sexual assault victims and their families. Services include:

- 24 hour Rapeline offering access to crisis intervention
- telephone counseling
- information and referral
- rape crisis advocates who respond on a 24 hour basis to accompany sexual assault victims to hospital emergency rooms, police departments and courtrooms
- prevention education
- professional in-service training
- clinical support groups for victims
- S.A.N.E. (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) Program, a collaborative project among MHA, Orange Regional Medical Center, St. Luke's Cornwall Hospital and the Orange County District Attorney's Office.

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners are specially trained forensic examiners who conduct evidentiary examinations and provide expert testimony in court.
