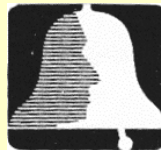

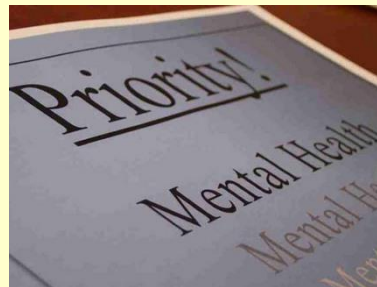

Facts about Sexual Assault

- 1 in 4 American women will be sexually assaulted in their lifetime. (National Institute of Justice, 2000.)
- In the U.S., 7 in 10 women who had sex before age 14, and 6 in 10 of those who had sex before age 15 report having had sex involuntarily. (Facts in Brief: Teen Sex and Pregnancy, The Alan Guttmacher Institute, New York, 1996).
- Women between the ages of 16-24 experience rape at rates four times higher than the rate for all women. (U.S Department of Justice, Office of Violence Against Women, Questions and Answers: Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Teen Dating Violence, and Stalking, 2009)
- Of women who report sexual assault, 40% are under the age of 18 and 15% are under the age of 12. (Bureau of Justice Statistics, 1994).
